

4-H Booth/Exhibit/Premium Information Lawrence County Fair

1. If any one project is taken by the whole club, the club can enter an educational group exhibit related directly to the project book. Only individuals judged can receive premium money.
2. All posters and board displays for individual projects should be no larger than 14" x 22". Club members should limit the use of posters; a real or model display is more attractive and interesting to the viewer.
3. 4-H Clubs must comply to the following 4-H Booth Exhibit Rules established by the 4-H Committee:
 - a. 4-H member must be judged to be paid a premium.
 - b. Let the Extension Office know if you want booth space at the County Fair.** Clubs will be given space for their exhibits in accordance with club size. Clubs with under 25 members will have a center aisle booth and clubs with 25 or more members will have a booth against the wall.
 - c. All clubs will provide their own supplies for the booth exhibit.
 - d. Booths will be graded as a whole. Each project will have contests similar to last year. There will be contests for the best booth. Booths will be divided by the number of members in the club
 - e. A premium of \$10.00 per booth will be paid.
 - f. All booths must be constructed and all projects placed in the booth by 1:00 p.m; Monday of fair week.** Advisors & members may work on their booths Sunday of fair week from 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. or anytime on Monday from 9:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m.
 - g. All booths should be labeled by club name, advisors and all exhibits should be identified with the 4-H member's name.
4. All general project judging will be conducted on an interview type basis with the quality of the exhibit considered. All livestock projects will be conducted on a skillathon basis for premium determination.
5. To add variety & interest 4-H members may exhibit other items in place of the project requirements listed, as long as the item is educational & related directly to information found in the pr
6. Any girl/boy who is enrolled in a 4-H club in Lawrence County and has completed the requirements of the club and project work, may exhibit and compete in project contests at the Fair.
7. Special contests will be provided for each project with awards going to the top three winners.

Premiums will be awarded based on interview/skillathon grades in ALL PROJECTS (INCLUDING MARKET LIVESTOCK) as follows:

A = \$7.00 B = \$5.00 C = \$3.00

Members with market livestock projects must participate in skillathons in order to sell in the Jr. Fair Auction. Members with market tobacco must participate in interview in order to sell.

TRASH CANS: Trash cans should be at least 30 gallon or larger. Must contain club name and a theme to promote 4-H. Trash cans can be left at the fair or taken back home. Awards are \$20, \$15 and \$10.

BENCHES: Benches must be at least 6 feet long, with or without a back. Must contain club name and a theme to promote 4-H. Benches can be left at the fair or taken back home. Awards are \$30, \$25 and \$20.

FLOWER POTS: Round or square flower pots must be 20" in diameter or larger. Rectangle flower pots must be at least 20" in length or larger. Pots should be decorated following a theme to promote 4-H. All flower pots should be removed from the fairgrounds when all other exhibits are released from the fair. Awards are \$20, \$15 and \$10.

Parade Awards will be given in three categories Walking, Floats, and Trucks

4-H Parade at the Fair--\$30, \$20, and \$15

Memorial Day Parade--\$25, \$15, and \$10
